

# **Body Quiz - Teachers Notes**

## **Learning Objectives**

1. To use vocabulary associated with the skeleton and bones.
2. To think about the body and skeleton facts.

## **Preparation**

1. Colour print this document ideally onto paper and laminate - alternatively, use thick card.
2. Cut each sheet up along the black lines to form playing cards
3. Use hoops or similar to create a Venn Diagram with sets "True", "Not True" and "Not sure".
4. The cards with red and green backgrounds are to be used by the Teacher to decide which statements are true and which are false.

## **Instructions**

1. Children to discuss and sort each statement onto Venn diagram – true, not true, not sure.
2. Teacher or children could think of other statements to fill empty boxes.

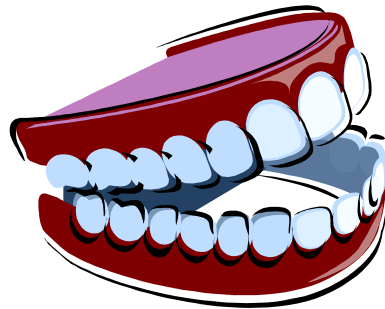
